BORIS BAKIJA – owner of the BALK company and **captain of Adriatic King**

Boris Bakija is an engineering technician by profession, but seaman and captain by passion. He has earned certification for captain of the ships up to 500 brt.

Boris's sea adventure began in 1989 when he went tuna fishing in the Pacific Ocean and spent the next 9 years at sea (?), until 1998. Upon his return home, he started a new venture and began growing his own fleet of fishing ships. By 2015, he had 3 of them. At the same time, he was running another family business, a small factory for fish processing which is still in operation today.

In 2015, Boris and his business partner bought a small cruise ship, Adriatic Queen, which they still own. In 2017, he decided it was time to say farewell to his fishing boats and he sold them. He bought another small cruise ship, Equator, which sailed for his company BALK during the seasons 2017, 2018 and 2019. At the end of season 2019, he sold Equator and began another era in his sea adventure. He started the construction of the new pearl in his crown, a new ship called Adriatic King which sailed for the first time on June 26th, 2021.

Boris always includes his family in his businesses. The company name, BALK, represents the initials of the Bakija family: Boris, Anita, Lovre and Katarina.

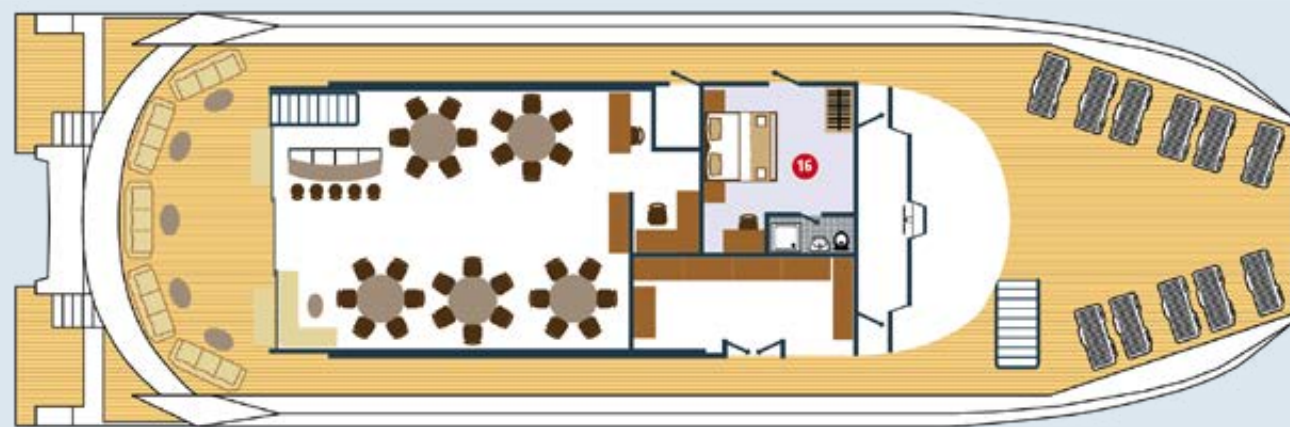

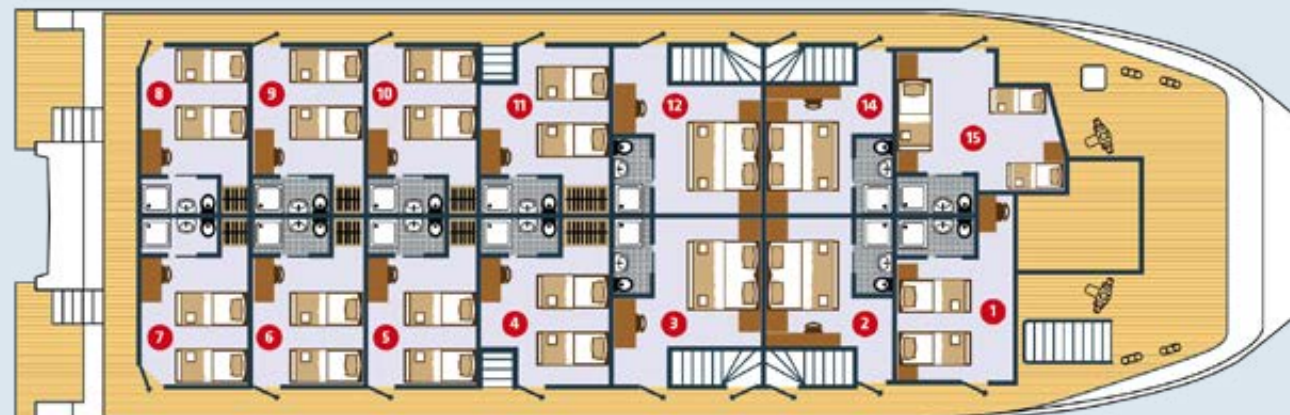

OUR STORY

The Pedišić family comes from the island of Pašman. For generations, our family has always had strong bonds to the sea since my grandfather was a fisherman and my father was a captain on transoceanic ships. Living with them taught me how to live with the sea and love it and it was precisely that love which led me to choose a fisherman's life. In my twenties, I bought my first fishing ship, Jadran III. At the very beginning of my career, I noticed big flaws in Croatian fishing, so I decided to try to innovate some necessary changes. I founded the first association of the fishing trawlers whose main goal is to improve the sustainability of sea resources through cooperation between the fishermen and the scientists. While seeking improved processes in fishing, I have always looked for new types of business and I found the perfect one in ecological touristic trawling. Touristic fishing offers the tourist the opportunity to get to know how professional fishermen work and at the same time, it is approved by organizations like UNDP and GEF.

My well-run business allowed me to buy another ship which carried the name of my grandfather. With the help of EU funding, I dismantled my fishing ship Ljubo and I decided to buy a small cruise ship with that money. In 2017, together with my business partner, I bought Adriatic Queen in Greece and that is how I took a new path in my life. My long-term experience as a fisherman gives me knowledge of some well-hidden and extremely beautiful spots of the Adriatic which I can show to our guests. The proof of great work and high-quality service is the prize for Best Ship which we obtained for season 2019. Our highly professional crew is the key to maintaining our top-quality service level. Our crew is made up of my family members: my wife Antonija, my 2 sons, Danijel and Petar, who work together with Miloš, the best chef in the fleet, Ante, the best waiter you'll ever meet and last, but definitely not least, Karmen, our omni-present housekeeper.

We invite you to be a part of the Adriatic Queen family and to experience some unforgettable moments in the most beautiful spots in the Adriatic.

8-day cruise: Split, Bol, Hvar, Mljet (Pomena), Dubrovnik, Korčula, Makarska, Pučišća, Split

DAY 1 / SATURDAY: SPLIT

Embarkation begins at 13:00h. Get settled in your cabin before attending a Welcome Reception followed by dinner this evening. Overnight in Split. **(WR, D)**

DAY 2 / SUNDAY: SPLIT – BOL – HVAR

In the morning, we leave Split and head to the island of Brač, to the picturesque town of Bol which is famous for its Golden Cape, the 530 m long golden pebble beach, unique since it changes its shape and position depending on the winds and currents. You will have time to walk around this small town, have a coffee or simply go swimming. Lunch on board. After lunch, we continue sailing along the beautiful coast, towards the island of Hvar. Upon arrival in Hvar in the afternoon, we join our guided city tour to discover its rich history, beautiful architecture, and important landmarks such as the Cathedral of St Stephen, the Theatre which is one of the oldest in Europe dating back to 1612, the Arsenal, and the Spanish Fortress. You will have a free evening to explore the town on your own and see what its night life has to offer. Overnight in Hvar. **(B, L)**

DAY 3 / MONDAY: HVAR – MLJET

Morning departure towards the island of Mljet, with plenty of time for a morning swim along the sail. Upon arrival in Pomena, you can visit the National Park, well known for its versatile ecosystem and two salt lakes ("Veliko Jezero" - Big Lake and "Malo Jezero" - Small Lake) as well as for its 12th-century Benedictine Monastery located on St Mary's Islet. In the evening, enjoy the Captain's Dinner on board. Overnight in Pomena. **(B, L, CD)**

DAY 4 / TUESDAY: MLJET - DUBROVNIK

In the morning we sail to Dubrovnik, a UNESCO World Heritage site. After a guided city tour, you will have plenty of free time to explore the rich history of the Old Town, visit some of the famous sights of the "Pearl of the Adriatic," ride a cable car to Srđ Mountain, stroll along the city walls, or take a boat ride to Lokrum island. Overnight in Dubrovnik. **(B, L)**



DAY 5 / WEDNESDAY: DUBROVNIK – KORČULA

Today we turn our compass back north towards the Island of Korčula. The city of Korčula is one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the Mediterranean, thought to be the birthplace of the famous explorer Marco Polo. Walking tour accompanied by our licenced guide. Join us for a tasting of the autochthone wines in a local winery. Enjoy your free evening to try some homemade dishes in one of the many restaurants. **(B, L, T)**

DAY 6 / THURSDAY: KORČULA – MAKARSKA

In the morning we continue sailing towards the town of Makarska. You will enjoy the views of the beautiful peninsula of Pelješac and have swim stop along the way. Lunch on board. Arrival in Makarska in the afternoon. Nestled below the mountain of Biokovo, the town of Makarska is one of jewels of Dalmatian tourism. You will have free time to explore the town at your own pace. Overnight in Makarska. **(B, L)**

DAY 7 / FRIDAY: MAKARSKA – PUČIŠĆA – SPLIT

On our final day, we sail across the Brač channel to Pučišća. Situated on the north side of the island of Brač in a deep fjord, Pučišća is famous for its quarries of the white stone which served for the construction of many notable buildings, among them, the White House in Washington DC. This picturesque place with beautiful facades is also famous for its unique school of stonemasonry. Return to the ship for lunch on board. In the afternoon, we finish our journey in Split, another UNESCO World Heritage site, best known for the glorious palace of the Roman Emperor Diocletian. After the guided city tour, you have a free evening to explore Split. **(B, L)**

DAY 1 / SATURDAY: SPLIT

Embarkation begins at 13:00h. Get settled in your cabin before attending a Welcome Reception followed by dinner this evening. Overnight in Split. **(WR, D)**

DAY 2 / SUNDAY: SPLIT – TROGIR

This morning you will get the opportunity to stroll through the streets of Split accompanied by our guide. Split is the second largest Croatian city, best known for its glorious palace of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1979. Return to the ship. Around noon, we set sail towards our first stop, the city of Trogir, another UNESCO World Heritage site. While sailing towards Trogir, your lunch will be served. We will also make a swim stop along the way and we'll arrive in Trogir in the afternoon. We can only know about the sea conditions and possibility of entrance on the same morning of the visit. In case we are lucky enough to get to see the Blue Cave, we will arrive in Vis after lunch. Vis is a small town on an eponymous island, well known for its strategic importance through the years. You will have free time to explore Vis at your own pace and visit one of its many fortresses, such as the Fortress of Saint George. Since it was closed during the time of ex-Yugoslavia, the wonderful island is still like an unspoiled and preserved oasis. Overnight in Vis. **(B, L)**

Morning departure towards the island of Korčula, with plenty of time for swimming along the sail before lunch. The city of Korčula is one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the Mediterranean, thought to be the birthplace of the famous explorer Marco Polo. After arriving in Korčula in the afternoon, you will join our guide for a walking tour of Korčula. After the walking tour, enjoy your free evening to try some homemade dishes in one of the many local restaurants. Overnight in Korčula. **(B, L)**

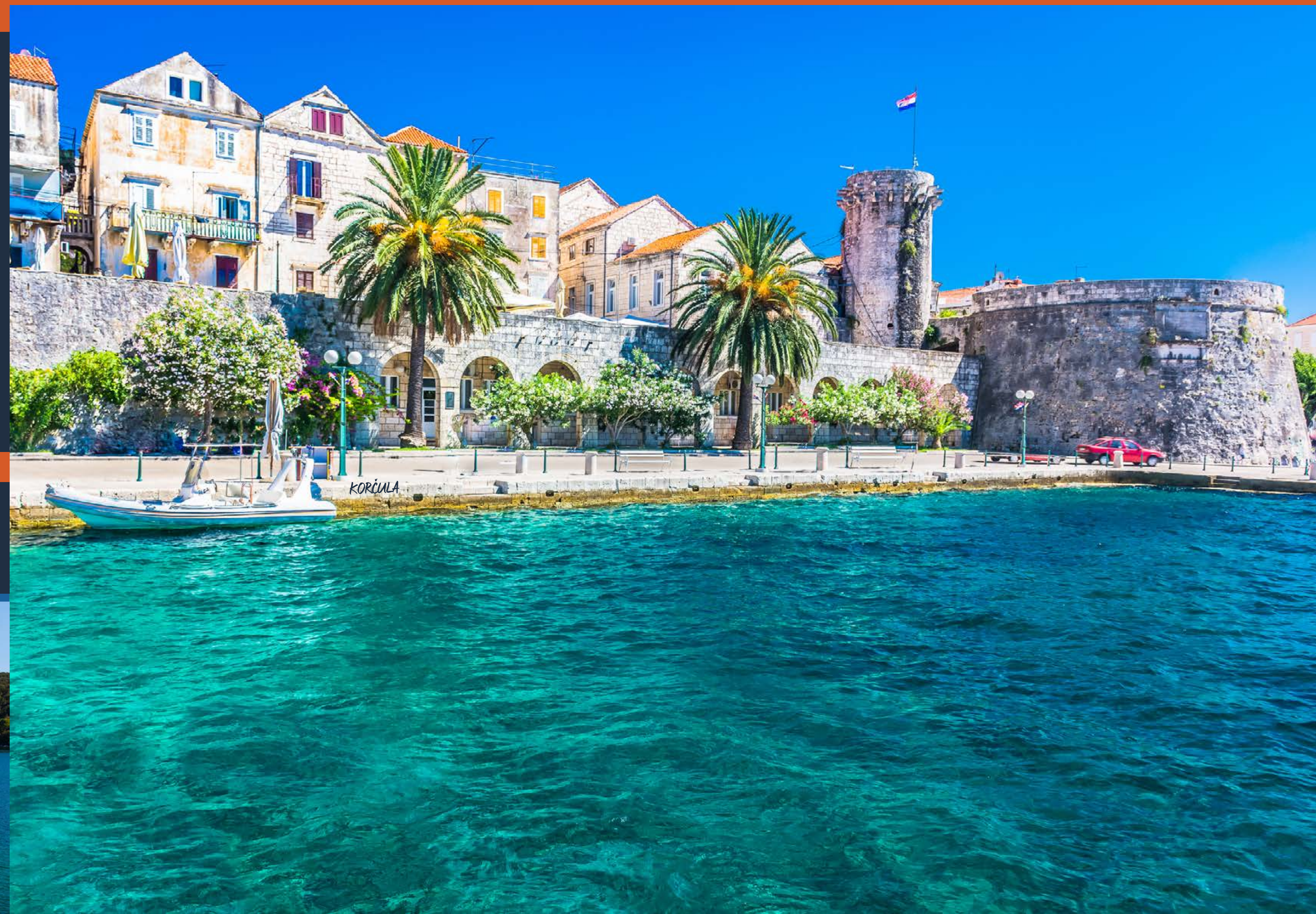

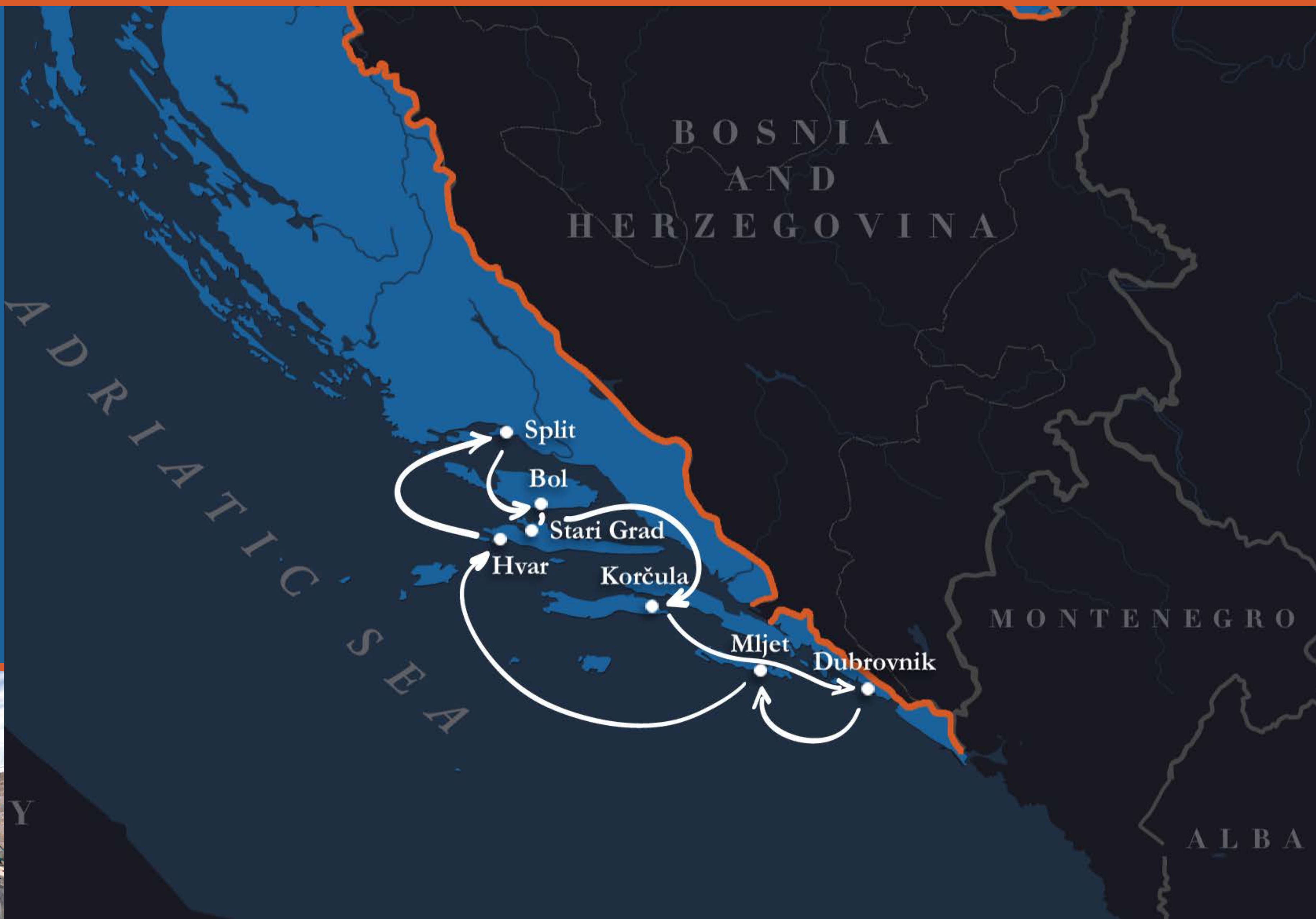

Cancellations

All payments and contract are non-cancellable and non-refundable, and full charter payment whether ship sails or not, is due in full.

Airport/Ship Transfers

Transfers between the local airport and the ship on the day the cruise begins, and between the ship and hotel or local airport on the day the cruise ends. There may be a waiting period between transfers of two hours or more unless private car transfers have been purchased. Private car transfers are only available on the cruise or cruise/tour start/end dates and are only available for transportation between designated airports and the ship, for up to two guests per car. If your flight arrangements arrive/depart outside of these parameters, you must make your own transfer arrangements.

Baggage Fees, Baggage and Personal Belongings

IWOT allows two (2) suitcases, one (1) carry-on bag, and one (1) personal bag (handbag, computer case, etc.) per person onboard our ships and motorcoaches. Airlines may have additional baggage restrictions and may impose additional fees for checked baggage and/or excess baggage. Keep an eye on your baggage—it is your responsibility throughout the trip. Itineraries are subject to change without notice and may need to be altered specifically because of weather, wind factors, or other conditions.

Advanced, Cancelled, or Delayed Sailing

IWOT reserves the right to cancel, advance, postpone or modify scheduled departure, return or itinerary dates, as well as locations, events, and schedules, and may, but is not obligated to, substitute, vary, alter, reschedule, cancel and/or relocate any accommodations, vessels, modes of transportation and other aspects of the vacation. IWOT is authorized to take these actions due to causes or circumstances of any

kind or nature beyond IWOT's control or causes or circumstances within IWOT's control that IWOT deems to make such actions appropriate. IWOT will not be liable for cancellation, delay, rescheduling or other adjustment or impact to a departure or itinerary, or other aspects of the vacation brought about due to force majeure or other circumstances beyond its control that prevent or interfere with any aspect of the cruise/tour, also including governmental and administrative actions.

Extensions/Land Tours

Security

- We welcome passengers with special needs or disabilities, however, as many sites are not accessible to the physically challenged, those needing wheelchairs, oxygen, or other ambulatory assistance will find the tour extremely limiting in their experiences. Guests with medical needs of a physical nature should bring a personal attendant to assist them. Passengers are required to advise IWOT at time of booking of any physical, medical, or other special needs that require accommodation. After the time of booking, should a Passenger develop a physical or medical condition that requires accommodation the Passenger is required to advise IWOT immediately.
- IWOT may impose safety requirements necessary for the safe operation of the tour, cruise, and land tours from the cruise. IWOT may also exclude an individual from participating in a tour or an activity if that individual's participation poses a direct threat to health or safety.
- IWOT does not provide personal devices (such as wheelchairs, hearing aids or prescription eyeglasses) or services of a personal nature (such as pushing a wheelchair or assistance

in eating, toilet, or dressing). A companion capable of providing such assistance must accompany any passenger who requires services of a personal nature.

- IWOT does not employ medical personnel. Any necessary medical attention will be provided by a local facility at the passenger's expense. This Agreement shall be construed according to the internal laws of New York without regard to conflicts of law principles. All claims must be submitted in writing and received by IWOT no later than 60 days after completion of the IWOT charter. Claims not submitted and received within this time shall be deemed to be waived and barred. In any legal action, arbitration, or other proceeding to enforce, interpret, or construe the terms of this Agreement, or concerning any grievance relating to the cruise and/or tours, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover actual reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses.
